NICK'S STORY:

Well..... It all started about 2 years ago when Matilda purchased her green machine, her new MX-5. Every weekend before the club's Wakefield day I would pester her to

take her MX-5 (and me) to the track to see what the little beast could really do. Each time I would give her 24 good reasons why we should go. Statements like "Other members have been going for years and their MX-5's still purr like new" would not budge her. The response was always that we had not chalked up enough kilometres and that we were still running "Him" in. (How much is enough kilometres ?? -Him ???)

Finally after about 18 months and some 15,001 kilometres later, I was able to pour a few extra glasses of red wine than normal into her, she said YES !!!!. But, we had to agree that we would take it easy on the track. My response was - "Sure".

We turned up for our first day at Wakefield very excited, anxious, nervous, cautious (I felt like I could have done with a scotch to calm the nerves). Our concerns were quickly put at ease. The club's Competition Committee and their helpers who orchestrate the day were well organised. The Competition Committee takes great care to ensure that first timers were made welcome and felt comfortable about driving on the track. From the driver's briefing, which went into detailed tips, to a more comforting beginner's orientation - a few laps around the track with an experienced driver. Well.... This was enough for Matilda, there was no holding her back now. I was now no longer required to test drive "Him" first - she could wait no longer.

The briefing was excellent and covered tips on cornering and things to remember - braking, (squeeze but don't jump on the brakes), gear change smoothly (blip the motor) and ESPECIALLY not to feel that you had to drive fast, but to drive at a pace you are comfortable with.

Matilda absorbed the tips and did take it easy on the track - for about the first 2 laps. She also felt that the above advice might not all be applicable to "Him". Like do you really have to squeeze the brakes really hard and wear them out? Matilda got to the corners fast but then kept going, screaming straight out into the dirt and grassy paddock. This experience took her to the opposite extreme - she got to the corners and then jumped on the brakes (stuff not wearing the brakes out!!!) this gave her excellent practice on doing 360's off the track and back into the grass and dirt again. The list went on and on and on.

By the end of the day Matilda did virtually everything that Ed and the guys said not to do, and in fact, I think she created additional items that were to be added to the "Not to Do" list. Surprisingly, after

interior looked like it sprouted grass and needed trimming and the tyres (which were fortunately already close to replacement), now had flat spots all over them. With encouragement from everyone (thanks Ed), Matilda decided that we were coming back to Wakefield.

My orders: "Get something for next time that will make us stick better to the track" (I took this to mean new tyres).

2 months later, we were back at Wakefield with track tyres. The new tyres were excellent compared to our previous set and stuck to the track extremely well. This boosted Matilda's confidence dramatically improved her lap times (she was now rapidly closing the gap on my times. No more tips from me girl, you are on your own!). She still managed to entertain the spectators though, by leaving the track at non-designated exit points (even during cool down laps), but it was nowhere near as dramatic as on our first trip to the track.

Matilda's improved lap times earned her the



year's Super Sprint Series.

We asked Matilda (our current Treasurer) and her husband Nick for an account of their first Wakefield staying on the track for a full few laps, experience and first round with the MX5 Team in this she started to get it all together and

managed to get reasonably good times. Later she agreed that in fact, all the advice given at the start of the day was actually pretty well spot on.

During the post mortems of the day, Matilda felt that she was probably a little bit hard on "Him". He was now a little hard to recognise - a dusty mission brown, the

normal warm hugs and congratulatory pats on the back, and in the heat of day, the smell of petrol fume and melted rubber, someone (I think it was Ed) suggested that we should join the MX-5 Super Sprint team. I thought Matilda didn't even register this comment like when I speak to her - I was wrong. On the way home Matilda decided that as well as coming back to Wakefield that we were now also going to try the Super Sprints!





MAZDA'S HOTTING UP IN-SIDE AND OUT

The latest in brains and looks from Mazda will give us something to warm our thoughts over these bleak winter weeks.

You're stuck in one of those grey morning traffic jams and you've got an urgent email to send. Or you want to check the cricket score — in Barbados? Well, here's the shot, right there on the dashboard.

Mazda Motor Corporation will be the first Japanese carmaker to provide a free Internet information service to drivers to operate in conjunction with car navigation systems.

The service will be linked to a server in what the company calls the "Mazda Telematics Centre," (MTC) and will be launched next month. It is being offered free of

charge or membership fee to any Mazda customer who has a vehicle equipped with a compatible car navigation system.

It will enable drivers in Japan to send and receive emails as well connect with over 10 million services, including news, weather, hotels, restaurants, shops and service stations.

Accessed by a mobile phone, users of the Mazda Telematics Centre will also be able to customize a home page of preferred information through the use of large display icons and a local memory bank designed to assist the speed of retrieval.

By adding a home PC to the system, drivers will also be able to map out a travel route, book travel arrangements and find a movie venue - before stepping into the car.

The MTC's direct-to-vehicle email link will also allow remote on-board diagnosis as well as scheduled maintenance requirements.

You want to know how to get more style out of Mazda style?

Enter 'Briza' limited model variants in the 121 Metro, 323 Astina, Premacy, 626 Wagon and Bongo Friendee, a big hit in Japan after their recent release.

Each 'Briza' (from the ancient Spanish word meaning 'gentle breeze') model offers a more stylish and sporty appearance through the use external aero body parts as well as interior equipment changes including white meter sets, revised trim and, in the Bongo Friendee, a large ottoman.

This is just the beginning of what Mazda in Japan calls its "MM" — More Mazda — project which will see the company continuously introduce new product variations in response to the 'voice of the customer'.

Mazda Australia is keenly watching developments but can't say when the Barbados results will be able to be e-mailed into an MX-5 at Bondi.

The good old fashioned radio will have to suffice for the time being, but then we have the sunshine – (too look forward too!)

Well as I say I have really enjoyed my position as Club Captain and I hope that I can catch up with you soon on a run.






