The MX-5 Club has always tried to deliver value to its members. Welcome to Fiona Shedden as Regalia Officer and Gordon Stephens as the new Governance Officer. A big thank you to John Purcell who is taking on the Club Captains role, having previously been the Hunter Convenor with Chris Cameron for the last 3 years.

I look forward to working with the new committee over the next 12 months to continue the great events that our Club has become well known for.
