

aula explains the details and since I am a fan of Mickey Mouse


OK. I should be able to drive every day. I work at Bondi Junction and live at Annandale so it will not be too far to the city each lunch time.

Since being elected last November, the new Committee has been like little ducks on the pond, with lots of effort going on underneath the water to maintain the momentum that had been built up by the previous Committee to turn this into the best MX-5 Club in Australia.

The Club was officially incorporated on the 20th January 1994 and in line with the new constitution, the Committee will take far greater responsibilities in the day to day running of the Club, bringing only those matters that are necessary, or believed to be contentious, to General Meetings for discussion.

The Committee has made several changes which we believe will be to the benefit of the members. This includes only four General Meetings during the year instead of six, changing the venue of the General Meetings, and including a guest speaker or special event at each meeting. There will be four issues of the Club magazine during the year in addition to a Club Events' flier which will let members know exactly what's happening in advance, on a regular basis.

Being conscious of a higher than acceptable loss of members, we are trying to set up a programme that will cater for both younger and older members, be they male or female, single or married. This will include a balanced mix of drives, social activities and sporting events.

The Club has already had a busy couple of months, with excellent attendance at all the organised events and with an obvious increase in attendance of younger and new members. If you are a member who has been around for some time but

hasn't attended events recently, I would encourage you to think again about coming along and enjoying yourself at Club activities.

Apart from regular events, the Club participated in the Disney Parade and generated some additional income for the Club. My special thanks to Captain George Russ for co-ordinating this activity and those who participated (see separate article).

George and the Social Secretary Ruth Simpson were able to get a press release into the Sydney daily papers, as well as many motoring magazines, which has brought us a rush of new member enquiries.

I am happy to report that it looks like there will be 13 cars going from NSW to the first national meeting in Adelaide, with the expectation of between 60 and 70 cars participating all together. This will be a magnificent event and we hope that our contingent takes out many honours.

was the first General as well as interaction and discussions


During the night we also signed up 4 new members, including Mr Bob Hall, an American who was one of the people who developed the original concept of the MX-5. We will hear more from Bob in the future

Bryan: George..... this is Bryan (I had this funny feeling it would be him) Did you say that you will have a shave?


George: Yes (I thought I made it quite obvious on his answering machine, but I guess something like this needs to be double checked)




It was also good to see so many people socialising and looking at each other's 'toys' after breakfast. Several cars stayed in the area for the remainder of the day, going on local drives.

Another Milestone for MX-5

It seems only yesterday that we received news from Mazda in Hiroshima that 250,000th MX-5 had rolled off the production line and was heading for Australia. It was exactly one year ago that Mazda Australia hosted a gathering of the Mazda MX-5 Club Presidents to meet that car at the Melbourne Motor Show. Now, just four years and nine months after MX-5 number one rolled off the line, MX-5 number 300,000 has been born. It took only 19 months from the startof production to reach the 100,000 mark, a further 16 months to pass 200,000 and now another 22 months to surpass 300,000. In that time, theMX-5 has received more than 70 major international motoring awards... and the answer to that often-asked question, "How many MX-5s have been sold in Australia?" The total is now 3,780 and going strong
