

## Competition Report – February 2008.

Since the last edition of Club Torque most of the competition scene has been in recess. However there were a few things happening over the December - January period.

On Saturday the 8th of December a number of club members attended the New South Wales CAMS Presentation Night at the Canada Bay Club. Two of our members Matilda Mravicic and David Raddatz received awards for their success in State Events in 2007. Matilda was runner-up in the Supersprint Championship and David Raddatz was the winner of the Production Sports Car Race Championship. Congratulations to Matilda and David.

On the following weekend yours truly and Peter McAulay competed in the AROCA Victoria supersprint at Phillip Island, I had some unfinished business to attend to following the same event in 2006. Peter recorded a best time of 2.01.90 in his "SP" whilst I recorded a best of 2.04.17. It's a long way to Phillip Island but the experience of driving the track including the number of laps completed makes it well worthwhile. I'm sure I'll be tempted to return in 2008.

In January I was fortunate to be allowed to drive MX-5 Racing's very pretty red NB 8B 'coupe' to the Presidents BBQ at Garden Island. This car is only one of 350 cars built by Mazda

for the Japanese market. Mazda built one hundred and fifty 1600s and two hundred 1800s, the red one being an 1800 A big thank you to Chris Gough of MX5 Racing for loaning me the car. Whilst it did not perform any differently to the open cars its body stiffness was far superior, as one would expect. Unfortunately this particular car cannot be registered in Australia, which is a great pity. Chris currently has a second 'coupe' in his workshop and it is hoped that this second car may be able to be registered. I certainly hope so. These are the only two in Australia. For those going to the Wakefield Park Track Day or 'run' on the 17th February, you will get another chance to view this beautiful and unique MX-5 on the 17th.

On Friday the 25<sup>th</sup> January a group of MX-5ers sampled the re-surfaced Wakefield Park circuit at an open practice day. As well as the resurfacing, the edges of the track have been repaired giving much safer run off should you venture off the 'black stuff'.

Overall the new work gets the thumbs up with lap times likely to fall by one second per lap. Talking of Wakefield Park we have fifty entries for our opening Track Day of 2008 on the 17<sup>th</sup> February. We are looking forward to a fine day following all of the recent rain.

On the weekend of the 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> of February the Production Car 12-hour

race meeting was run at Mount Panorama Bathurst. Unfortunately the MX-5 Racing entry was a withdrawal prior to the event. Never the less club member Zane Al-said acquitted himself very well in the three Formula Vee support races finishing with a seventh, twelfth and fourteenth in a field of fifty five cars. Zane's best lap was a very credible 2 minutes 47seconds. Also included in this edition of Club Torque is a 2008 calendar of the motor sport events of interest to club members in New South


