## From the Editor's Desk

I was down at Brookvale Mazda a couple of weeks ago, on a friendly visit to meet their new salespeople and leave our club membership application forms for them to handout to new MX-5 buyers. I was curious to ask how sales were going with the MX-5 plus what's new in the 93 model. "Well, sales is down, but we are the top dealer for selling MX-5's; this is the Northshore you know!" the salesman said.

I guess surveys show that people living on the Northshore of Sydney are more affluent with many professional people living there? But probably more important is that they would have a higher disposable income; they would have to with the price of a fully optioned MX-5 now costing over \$40K on the road, plus the mandatory theft alarm; not to mention the sky-high comprehensive insurance premiums (especially for under 25's). Arh, tis the price to pay to own a ragtop.

At first glance the 93 model looked essentially the same car as first released late in 1989. The following were my observed differences:

- \* Power steering
- \* Performance bar on rear suspension frame.
- \* Remote boot release.

- \* Rear demister and inner lining on Hardtop.
- \* Matching colour on Hardtop.
- \* Oddments box (centre console)
- \* Change in rear gate panel and badges
- \* New Mazda emblem on wheel trim and bonnet.
- \* Warranty is now 3 years, 80,000km
- \* Colour options now include silver and Black

I remember when I purchased my MX early 1990 the fully optioned vehicle then was \$35K incl. on road costs. The re-sale value of a vehicle of my vintage is around \$25K-\$27K with a Hardtop and air-cond in the private market. The limited edition greens are holding their price very well at around \$36K.

So, it's a bargain paradise for second hand MX-5 buyers at the moment. I have seen many original buyers keeping their cars in pretty good nick with very low kilometres and are now selling.

On another note, the last couple of months have been pretty lean on letters to the editor. Can we have some letters, please.



useless except to crawl to a garage, it's completely useless when the pressure is way below 60 lb/s. in, which it usually is because few people think to check it, and, to add to all these woes, it's illegal! Yes, your friendly (read bloody-minded) Transport Department Officer will take great pleasure in relieving you of \$150, if he catches you. Yes, Big Brother ( you do as you're told) is alive and well and flourishing in Queensland. Ask all the members who have been fined for the heinous crime of a muddy number-plate, or a bent number plate, or no number plate. George Orwell was right, and our freedoms have gradually been taken from us, and all we have left is our ghastly, flat, illegal spare wheel.

At Morning Tea we were joined by a machine that embodies the tradition that inspired the creation of the MX5. A shiny MG in the traditional British Racing Green.




