STOP PRESS! - The club will be conducting a SPEED EVENT SERIES comprising Supersprints at Amaroo Park on July 12, September 13 and November 22 with the final event being a hillclimb at Ringwood (Raymond Terrace) on December 6. Handsome Trophies will be awarded at the Club's Annual Christmas function including a Ladies Trophy, so come on girls! ---SUPERSPRINTS: WHAT ARE THEY? -- Supersprints are timed lap dashes-two cars at a time.
