Let the Buyer Beware ... of some dealers and their labour estimates

Club member, Bob Lynch, discovered that both of his break lights stopped working. Bob took his car to a prominent Sydney Mazda dealer to see what the problem was. The problem was traced to the brake light switch behind the brake pedal. They quoted him \$19.20 for the switch plus approximately 1.5 hours labour at \$70 / hour to install the new switch. Another dealer quoted a similar price for the switch but said it would take about 40 minutes to fit.

Being a discerning buyer, Bob contacted JUSTMX5 for a price on the part. He was quoted \$25.00 for a second hand switch including fitting. Bob took the drive out to Kirrawee to get the part. Stephen Thatcher removed the old switch, and fitted and adjusted the newly purchased second hand switch in just under 10 minutes. The lessons from this episode are two

The lessons from this episode are two fold. First, remember to shop around to different dealers when wanting repair work done because their quoted labour times and rates can vary considerably, and; second, always remember to check out the prices of second hand parts dealers when looking for replacement parts.

NRMA Insurance Replies

ou may remember that in the last edition of ClubTalk we reprinted a letter that I wrote to NRMA requesting clarification of the new exclusion clause (effective for all NRMA comprehensive policies renewed after 1 August 1996). Below is a copy of the reply from the

Underwriting Manager of Motor Vehicle Insurance.

When reading the reply you will see that it only addresses why the clause was added and not what it actually means. In response to this new clause from the NRMA some members have, when

renewing their policies, filled in a disclosure form stating that they participate in social drive organised by the car club and that these event are NOT competitive.

Basically it is better to be safe rather than caught out at claim time. CT

Dear Mr Russ,

Your recent facsimile which was sent to our Motor Vehicle Insurance Department has been forwarded to me as Underwriting Manager for reply. May I first apologise for the delay as we have no record of having received your first correspondence sent in September.

In response to your enquiries regarding coverage under the new NRMA Comprehensive Insurance policy booklet (Cover for Cars and Motor Cycles) by members of motoring clubs, I would like to provide clarification of the intention of the exclusion and clarify some of the concerns in your correspondence.

The particular area of the policy which has raised concerns is exclusion 7 on Page 18 which states:

'your vehicle was being used for events relating to a motor vehicle club, bash or charity event (unless you have told us your vehicle will be used for any of these purposes and we have agreed to cover it).'

As a community minded organisation the NRMA recognises the importance of motor vehicle clubs, bashes and charity events and this has not changed. However, the experience of NRMA Insurance Limited has shown that in some events in the above categories, participants may be encouraged to drive in a competitive manner, for example, time trialing, cannonball run, racing type activities, which increases the risk of an accident. Whilst we have a racing exlcusion in our policy it has been argued in the past, for example, that what we have deemed a race activity was actually a club activity or event. For this reason the exclusion was introduced as it has never been our intention to cover this type of risk.

To use the examples mentioned in the copy of your first correspondence, I would not expect policy holders to advise us if they were to attend, for example, a ten pin bowling night or the regular meeting at the clubhouse or a picnic day where the types of competitive / racing activities outlined above did not exist.

May I stress that the reason NRMA requests policy holders to inform us prior to taking part in a club event is to ensure that they fully understand the policy cover in these situations.

We are committed to ensuring that our policy holders are not paying higher premiums than necessary casued by the acceptance of higher than average risks and this exclusion will assist us in achieving this commitment.

I thank you for your feedback as we actively encourage our policy holders to do so in order that we keep in touch with our customers and further improve our policies.

I hope this letter has provided you with better understanding of the reasons for this exclusion and the intention of the exclusion.

The 400,000th MX-5 has rolled off the production line in Japan.

The MX-5, is rapidly closing in on the legendary British MGB as the world's best-selling two-seat roadster.

Considering that the MX-5 is a selfish car with seating for two and only the bare minimum of luggage space, the fact that it's now headed towards the half-

half-million mark is simply astounding.


The 400,000th car - jet black at that - came off the production line in Hiroshima just 7 1/2 years after the first car appeared in April 1989.
