

Wood grain Panel

Now this is the way to finish offjust have a look at Jeff's car with the new leather seats and beige top to the final touch of wood grain panel on the dash.

OK, thanks Zan, I'll take over from here. (J.G.)

As many of you will be aware, my car has been "enhanced" a little, starting with the Simmons B45 wheels, which were also fitted to my white '92, a full Loch Stewart exhaust system and Cold Air intake. Next, came the Mazda body kit (front air dam and side skirts) minus the rear spoiler which I really don't like, and a set of Mazdaspeed "look-alike" headlight covers.

When I ordered the car originally, I had wanted the Leather Package as sold in the US and Japan and Canada, i.e., Grace Green with tan roof and upholstery, Mazda in their wisdom, elected not to make that an option, so when the opportunity presented itself for me to replace the roof with a US spec tan one, I jumped at it and at the same time, had the seats reupholstered in matching tan, by John Canilho in Sydney. The result, I think, is stunning.

There was still something missing though, the leather looked great but the cockpit still lacked warmth. An



ow can you find out more about Lthe MX-5? I guess you'd call that an FAO (Frequently Asked Question). The answer, is relatively simple, if you have Internet access, use a search engine such as Yahoo, or Web Ferret, just type in MX-5 or Miata and sit back and watch as a very large number of web sites around the world, devoted to the MX-5, appear. Most notable of those is Miata Net http://www.miata.net. which also has links to several other very relevant MX-5 (Miata) sites. There is also a link to the Miata Club of America, publishers of the Miata Magazine, the only English language magazine, devoted to the MX-5.



Subscription details can be found at the MCA site http://www.miataclub. org/. Other features of Miata Net, are a lively forum and also a mail list, both of which cover a lot of relevant MX-5 issues, be prepared though, if you subscribe to the mail list, to receive anything up to 200 messages per day. There is also an archive section, which can be searched for information.

Another reason to have a look at Miata Net, is the large number of Vendors, who display and mail order, extras/accessories for the MX-5, some of which are "Left Hand Drive" specific, but many which are universal.

#### **New Name Badges**




You are the most patient of people.


Despite the minor catastrophes all ended well and we all had a blast, well at least I did. Ed and Patsy organised a great evening.



#### **NEWELL'S NOTES**

Time to start counting down the days for the Mazda family's newest and *very* welcome arrival, the Tribute four wheel drive wagon, which was previewed to much applause in the United States.

In local terms it's a real corker, handling looks as well as it handles on the road.

A perfect big brother for the MX-5, the Tribute is bigger and more powerful than the Honda CRV and Toyota Rav-4.

Styling is from the combined design forces of Mazda Japan, Germany and the US and

the result is a sophisticated and expressive monocoque-bodied vehicle carrying the Mazda 'family' new look up front with a five point grille, floating emblem and sculptured bonnet.

With comfort a priority in the Tribute's design, five adults swinging their cats can happily settle in the cab with a couple of suitcases and mountain bikes in the back.

The Tribute's power is supplied by a 2.0 litre four cylinder or 3.0 V6 engine and the transmission has an 'on demand' 4WD function via a 'rotary blade' coupling system that overrides front wheel drive if needed, transferring up to 50 per cent of the

power to the rear wheels (for instance in slippery road conditions).

The Tribute's wheelbase is 2,618mm with a 1,549 track and the construction features Mazda's 'Triple H' safety reinforcement, fully independent front strut and rear multi link suspension and precise power assisted rack and pinion steering.

Standard ventilated front disc brakes and rear drums can be boosted by optional four-wheel Anti-lock Brake System (ABS) and the sophisticated electronic system that replaces the conventional mechanical dual-proportioning valve, Electronic Brake Force

Distribution (EBD).

The elegant light-duty four wheel drive Tribute will hit the streets in 2001 but if you're in the right place at the right time you can grab a sneak preview at the Melbourne Motor Show where the

pre-production concept wagon known as the "Activevehicle" will be on display.

Now, any additional MX-5 model is bound to grab the attention of club members and the latest six-speed, chrome-kissed Limited Edition MX-5 Heritage Series absolutely drips with grace and style.

Holding the steering wheel in your hands is like holding hands with a screen star on a cool and blissful walk down the boulevard.

The Heritage's body paint is an understated deep metallic burgundy (creatively called 'Art Vin'), delicately offset by rich parchment leather seats with matching soft interior and folding roof.

A Nardi steering wheel, gear shift knob, centre console and parking brake handle are an elegant wood-grain finish that gives a classic look and feel. Added to this is the chrome ringed white faced instruments,


chrome inner door handles, park brake button and door scuff guards. It'll be hard task taking your eyes or hands off this delightful Limited Edition MX-5 Heritage Series, but only 100 of the cars are available in Australia.

The 121 Metro car-wonder has become just that little bit bigger for its boots.

'Face-lifted' models of the tall and compact car are on sale from March and have the unmistakable modern front and grille of the Mazda family, with re-styled headlights. Other tweaks include roof rails, flashier rear tail lights for the 1.5 litre model, new savvy colours – inside and out and a slightly refined dashboard design.


Already known as a minx for its ability to swallow-up people, luggage, shopping, sports and leisure gear while fitting into parking spaces it shouldn't, the 121 Metro continues to output surprising power and economy from its 1.5 and 1.3 engines. 


